

What do *you* want out of a job/project/etc? Why?

- I want to build skills that will make me relevant and helpful to the greater AIS field. More concretely, I want to be better at:
  1. Communication and organization of people, group chats, etc.
  2. Creating an environment that is not just energized and enthusiastic (my default community building habit), but also deeply motivated for the problem/project at hand.

What's the strongest kind of value you can provide a job/project/etc? What holes can you fill?

- Currently, I would fit into a sort of "connector" role. I find value in asking people questions and knowing them deeply, and am doing my best to connect people on a 1-on-1/intrapersonal level. I have not yet begun to string groups or task forces together, but this could be another goal of my work in fieldbuilding or communications.

What preferences & constraints are most strong, idiosyncratic, surprising, cutting-out-the-most-option-space, etc?

Preferences:

- I love talking to people and have pretty far above average social experiences pertaining to presentations through consulting and other competitions as well as DECA (1-on-1 interview style business presentations throughout high school which I was pretty good at (see resume achievements section))

Constraints:

- I do not come from a STEM background, which would in the near term limit my ability to contribute to the *technical* safety space personally
- I feel a strong responsibility to rehabilitate the UW-Madison EA group this coming fall and academic year, which had <15 members. This will likely require 10+ hours of work from me each week
- Overall I am entry level worker, but I am spending a lot of time in Constellation (flew in on my own dime to Berkeley from Madison, Wisconsin) and around Generator folks to upskill extremely quickly!

What are some example jobs/opportunities/projects that you'd be especially excited about? These can be totally unrealistic, even entirely fictitious :)

- Further policy and campaign work, either with Rutinel or Wiener or Bores in whatever else he does or at a think tank or whatever it may be. Through my lobbying with the American Heart Association, I really liked navigating meetings with legislators and making recommendations to them on policies. I have also deeply enjoyed working in more complicated social settings with politicians or people with different ideological backgrounds as I try to understand their opinions and get to know them better and why they hold the opinions they do. I found lots of fulfillment in educating people on important political issues while canvassing for Bores, especially when they did not previously care about them.

How can someone reading this doc be helpful? What are the top 1-3 actions they could take?

- Recommend other people to talk to that may be 4-6 months ahead of me in terms of career development
- Recommend fellowships or internships, courses, or conferences that may be helpful for me in making relationships or if I am able to help out with the organization or operations of said conference
